Renee Winner lives at 7300 St. Rt. 47 W., De Graff, Ohio with her husband Alan. They have ten children from age 26 to 2, Erin (& Ben) Luthman, Audrey (& Derreck) Dillon, Martha (& Derek) Zumberger, Ezra (deceased) Zebedee, Xavier, Rita, Ruth, Irene and Orville Winner. The children are homeschooled and members of Holy Family Home School Group.

Renee has lived and farmed in Logan County for 28 years. The family farms 3000 acres of 100% no-till on their soybeans and wheat and minimum till on their corn. They live in the Miami River Watershed and have incorporated many best management practices into their operation such as crop rotation, filter-strips, grassed waterways, quail buffer strips and a fertilizer containment facility. They also have over 600 acres of woodland, wetlands and foodplots. In addition they have 1446 acres preserved through the 10 year Agricultural Security Area Program, 1034 of those acres are also permanently preserved with the Ohio Department of Agriculture's Ag Easement Program, and they are in the process of finalizing 43 acres into a permanent easement with the Wetland Reserve Program.

They have a 230 head dairy operation at home and are building another dairy just down the road to support the second generation of the Winner family. They also have 12 brood ewes and a menagerie of other farm animals.

Renee is a member of Logan County Shepard's Club, Ohio Sheep Improvement Association, Logan County Farm Bureau, American Farmland Trust, and serves on the board for the Logan County Land Trust as Vice President. She is also a 4-H Advisor for Helping Hands 4-H Club and a former member of the 4-H Advisory Council. The family worships at Saint Mary of the Woods Church where Renee serves as a lector, cantor and extra-ordinary Eucharistic minister.
